



MEDIC First Aid Child/Infant CPR and AED Supplement

The *Child/Infant CPR and AED Supplement* program is designed to give students the knowledge and skills necessary to manage a cardiac arrest emergency for children and infants. This program should be used in conjunction with MEDIC First Aid's *BasicPlus CPR, AED, and First Aid for Adults*, and is based on the 2015 AHA Guidelines Update for CPR and ECC and other evidence-based treatment recommendations.



Intended audience

Individuals who are not healthcare providers or professional rescuers but desire or are required to be certified in Child and Infant CPR and AED.



Class configurations

- Max student to instructor ratio: 12 to 1 (6 to 1 recommended)
